Ornithologist Dr. Mike Baltz will provide an historical and ecological overview of the birds of The Bahamas as well as discuss conservation efforts on the islands. <u>Dr. Baltz's presentation will start at</u> our new meeting time of 6 P.M., in the meeting room at Carbondale Township Hall, 217 E. Main

St. Carbondale. Entrance to the Township Hall is from the rear of the building (216. E. Monroe St.) where two parking lots are available for use. Mask wearing is welcome but not required.

Dr. Baltz has a PhD in avian ecology from the University of Missouri. He lived and worked in The Bahamas and has studied and written extensively about West Indian birds, with an emphasis on neotropical migrants overwintering in the West Indies. While working for The Nature Conservancy, Dr. Baltz was part of a scientific team that helped establish a system of National Parks on Andros Island, Bahamas. Dr. Baltz has lived in Carbondale for over 20 years with his wife and two children.

Dr. Baltz will give details of a birding trip he will be leading to Andros Island. January 18-25th, 2025.

The SIAS Boom-Shakalaka Chachalacas will glide again...in the all-day IOS Fall Big Sit fundraiser to be held Sunday Sept. 22th at Evergreen Park, Carbondale on picnic day! Join Vicki Lang, Kimberly Rohling, and Rhonda Rothrock from 6:44 a.m. to 6:44 p.m. (or any time in between) as we attempt to identify and count as many bird species as we can in one day from a stationary, 17-foot diameter, area. Folks are invited to join in on the count for whatever period of time they choose or just come visit throughout the day, before, during, or after the SIAS picnic.

Last year our Big Sit team tallied 60 species. This year we're hoping for at least 65 species. And, we've set a donation goal of \$500 for this year.

The Big Sit is a fundraiser for the Illinois Ornithological Society's (IOS) Grant Program funding state-wide avian studies. SIAS has funded grants supporting studies in southernmost IL through IOS in the past. The 2024 Birding Blitz, Another Success!

While this is year 2024 and the Blitz was first held in 2002, it's actually only the 21th competition because we skipped the CoVid years 2020 & 2021. It is just so wonderful that the interest in and enthusiasm for the Blitz hasn't diminished. So many amazing folks have participated over the years and still are. And while the songbird fallout we all had hoped for didn't arrive for Saturday, the weather cooperated better than forecasted.

Seven teams, a total of 23 birders, registered and competed in 4 of the 5 Blitz categories, with the County category being favored by 4 teams. The other 3 categories had one team each competing. The overall winning team, the team with the highest species count, was the SI Hot Shots in the Open A (True Big Day) category, with 153 species! The Open B (Dawn to Dusk) category was one by the Just Winging It team with 112 species. The 49ers won the Senior (55 or Better) category tallying 107 species.

As I stated above, the County category was this year's favorite category, with 4 teams competing. The Raven Loonatics pulled off the win with 129 species found in Jackson County. Also, in this category were the Cache Bandits who chose Johnson County, tallying 114 species. The Warblords birded in Williamson County, tallying 118 species. And the Boom Shakalaka Chachalacas birded in Alexander County, tallying 120 species.

When we compiled an overall list of species see in our eleven southernmost IL counties on Saturday, the total was 184! The list included our featured

species, the red crossbill, located by the SI Hot Shots.

This year's Blitz collected \$2,102.00 in pledges! A special recognition goes to the 49ers team for raising \$1,060.00 of that total! And a huge Thank You to everyone who pledged their financial support for habitat restoration and preservation and/or helped again to make the event a success. Also, a shout out to the Haven and a Thank You to the Haven's caretakers Donna and Mark who always make us feel so welcome. Join Vicki & Rhonda for the Cache Fall Migration Mini-Sit on Sept. 14th

Join in on the 7^{5h} annual Cache River Wetlands Fall Mini Sit Sept. 14th, from 9 a.m. - noon!

A "mini-sit" is a bird watching event where the objective is to record as many bird species by sight and sound during a set period of time. This citizen science birdwatching event invites birders of all experience levels to enjoy fall migration. Pack your binoculars, scope, camera, lawn chair, beverages, and snacks. North Cypress Access is a charming, semi-secluded woodland with a small lake. It's located along Fain Lane. From the Intersection of IL Rt. 146 & IL Rt. 37, turn south onto IL Rt. 37. Go 3.8 miles to Bear Branch Rd., turn left (southeast). Drive Bear Branch to Old Cypress Rd., turn left (east). Drive Old Cypress Rd to Snake Hole Ln, turn right (south). Drive Snake Hole Ln to Fain Ln, turn left (east). Drive straight on Fain Ln to North Cypress Access parking lot. We're still hoping to top our 2019 high of 33 species!
